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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 7, 2018

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended March 31, 2018, that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks income with potential long-term capital growth by investing primarily in fixed income and income-oriented equities anywhere in the world, either directly or through other mutual funds. The Fund utilizes multiple portfolio management teams with a mix of investing styles. The Fund's asset mix will generally range between 45%–75% equities and 25%–55% fixed income securities. The Fund diversifies in terms of geographic exposure, sector exposure, company market capitalization, portfolio manager style, credit quality and duration.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a global income-oriented balanced fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and bond markets, and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Series PW securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the year, the Fund's Series PW securities returned 2.6% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 5.9% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index (returned 9.9%), and a 50% weighting in the ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned 1.9%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in the index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity markets advanced to record highs earlier in the year in response to accelerating synchronized global growth and low inflation. Market volatility remained low despite growing geopolitical tensions, specifically between the United States and North Korea, and a more aggressive tone from central banks around the world. However, market volatility returned in January as a result of concerns over global trade tensions, rising inflation and the removal of monetary stimulus.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Austria, Norway and Italy were the strongest performers in Canadian dollar terms, while Israel, Australia and New Zealand were the weakest. From a sector perspective, information technology, consumer discretionary and industrials were the strongest performers, while telecommunication services, consumer staples and energy were the weakest.

Developed global bond market returns varied over the year. The sovereign bond markets of the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom came under pressure as short-term yields rose significantly while long-term yields changed very little. In Europe, peripheral bond markets such as those of Italy, Spain and Portugal performed best, benefiting from the European Central Bank's bond-buying program. Emerging market bonds provided higher returns as higher interest payments generally offset price declines. The U.S. dollar weakened substantially, while the Canadian dollar weakened only moderately relative to the world's primary currencies. The strongest currencies were in Europe, where economic growth continued.

The Fund currently invests all its assets in other mutual funds managed by Mackenzie, and the following discussion reflects the activities of these underlying mutual funds. The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its exposure to fixed income, which underperformed equities. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison. The Fund underperformed the blended index primarily because of stock selection in the United States.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the health care and information technology sectors also detracted from performance. Stock selection in financials contributed, as did exposure to China.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, duration and yield curve positioning detracted from performance. Underweight exposure to Japan also detracted from performance, as did exposure to the Argentine and Turkish bond markets. Security selection in government bonds, and exposure to term loans, contributed to performance.

Within equities, the Fund partially hedged select foreign currency exposure, which detracted from performance primarily as the euro and the British pound appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar. Within fixed income, the Fund hedged approximately 80% of its foreign currency exposure. Exposure to currencies such as the Polish zloty and Swedish krona contributed to performance as they appreciated against the Canadian dollar, while exposure to weaker currencies, such as the Indian rupee and Turkish lira, detracted.



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Over the year, portfolio activity and market effect resulted in increased exposure to Canada, the United Kingdom and Australia, while exposure to Mexico, France and Denmark decreased. Within the equity portion of the Fund, exposure to the consumer discretionary sector increased, while exposure to real estate was eliminated. Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, exposure to corporate bonds increased, while exposure to foreign government bonds declined. The fixed income portfolio management team continually makes tactical adjustments to the Fund's fixed income allocations, so the year-end exposures do not necessarily represent a long-term strategic position.

Net Assets

The Fund's NAV increased by 183.7% to \$76.5 million at March 31, 2018, from \$27.0 million at March 31, 2017. This change was composed primarily of \$1.1 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and \$48.6 million in net sales.

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for Series PW of 2.06% during the year ended March 31, 2018, was slightly higher than the MER of 2.05% for the year ended March 31, 2017. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for each series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

Effective September 29, 2017, Alain Bergeron and Andrea Hallett, of the Mackenzie Asset Allocation team, became lead portfolio managers of the Fund. In addition to underlying fund selection, the team engages in active currency management and tactical asset allocation to take advantage of market opportunities.

The Mackenzie Asset Allocation team believes that global growth will slow while remaining strong, although some risk factors have emerged. In the United States, rising fiscal deficits, a strong economy, employment near full capacity and tighter monetary policy from the Federal Reserve are likely to put upward pressure on yields, in the team's opinion. In addition, rhetoric surrounding trade policy has escalated. The implementation of significant trade restrictions and tariffs could disrupt global trade and the economic cycle.

In Europe, strong growth and falling unemployment moved the European Central Bank closer to ending its ultra-easy monetary policy; its statement no longer references a possible extension of its bond-buying program.

In Canada, the team expects growth to moderate and gradually return to its long-term trend. Key risks to growth include uncertainty related to the renegotiation of the North American Free Trade Agreement, higher-than-expected inflation, elevated household debt and the housing market slowdown.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not otherwise included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to a related party transaction because it did not engage in any related party transactions.

Past Performance

The Fund's past performance information is presented in the following charts and table. It assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The charts and table do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. The past performance of the Fund is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

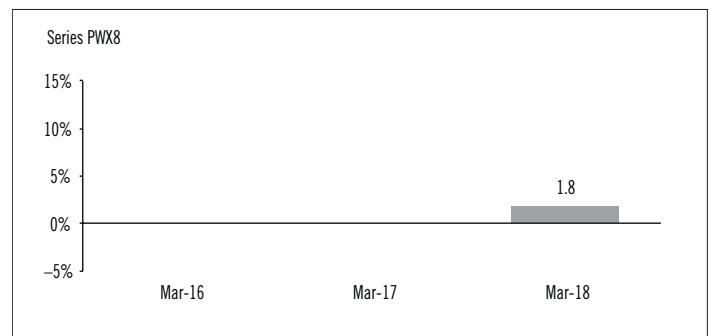

The blended index is composed of 50% MSCI World (Net) Index and 50% ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index.

The MSCI World (Net) Index is a free float adjusted, market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed markets. It consists of 23 developed market country indices. Net total returns are after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The ICE BofAML Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index tracks the performance of investment grade debt publicly issued in the major domestic and eurobond markets, including sovereign, quasi-government, corporate, securitized and collateralized securities. Qualifying bonds must be rated "BBB" or higher and have a remaining term to maturity of at least one year. The foreign currency exposure is hedged back to the Canadian dollar.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. Mackenzie also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with Mackenzie may be entitled to distribution-related payments from Mackenzie on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 38% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the year. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.
